— REFRESHMENTS —

CLARA SCHUMANN (1819-1896) Two Romances for Violin and Piano Op.22 (1853)

These are Clara's most popular pieces, and for good reason. They are compact, musically coherent and, above all, lyrical. She composed them for herself to perform with her friend, violinist Joseph Joachim (who introduced her to Brahms), and together they played them many times in concert.

LOUISE FARRENC (1804-1875) Trio in E minor for Flute, Cello and Piano Op. 45 (1862)

Louise Farrenc composed this trio during 1861-2 and is her last chamber work. A short fanfare, *Allegro deciso*, leads to the attractive and dramatic main movement, *Più moderato ed espressivo*. The second movement *Andante* is followed by a brilliantly conceived but restless *Scherzo vivace*. The last movement is a superb finale, marked *Presto*.

CLARA SCHUMANN (1819-1896) Two Songs (1841,1846)

Even in her teenage years, Clara had a firm command of compositional material, and it is clear from her early piano pieces that she had studied the works of Chopin and Mendelssohn. Her accelerated maturity was in part the result of the extended tours she undertook with her father when she was a child. In the late 1830s, Clara began study with Robert Schumann. Working with a new teacher, plus the natural growth in her musical maturity, led to a more subtle form of expression in her music

CLARA SCHUMANN (1819-1896) Piano Trio in G Minor, Op. 17 (1846)

Of all her compositions, this substantial chamber work (a performance runs approximately 30 minutes) invites the most speculation about all the great music Clara could have written if her circumstances had been different. Highlights include the deft fugal treatment of the main theme of the final movement and the gorgeous, plaintive melody of the *Andante* as it's passed among the three instruments.
